


BRICS NATIONS

Brazil

- 210 languages 80 Amerindian and 130 immigrant.
- Portuguese is the official language.
 Indigenous official language is Nheengatu.
- The Tupi people and Tapuias (non-Tupi people)
- Portuguese
- Disappearing languages
 Amerindian & African
- European: German, Italian, Spanish, Polish, Ukrainian
- Asian: Japanese, Chinese (Mandarin & Cantonese)
- Bilingual media: newspapers & magazines, Radio & TV, Churches
- Language lessons: printed & online

- Language lessons in printed media


Indo-Russian Friendship
